- A reduction of 3% per year on average in our greenhouse gas emissions
- An annual carbon budget presented by the Minister for Finance
- A high-level climate change commission
- An all party approach to climate change targets
- Social partnership status for environmental NGOs

A **carbon budget** is a set amount of carbon that can be emitted in a given amount of time, either by the whole economy, or a pre-selected subpopulation or set of activities.

Climate Protection Act

- 2050 and 2020 targets into law
- Average annual cut of least 3% into law
- Legislative framework for carbon budgeting
- Statutory role for commission on targets and measures
- Responsibility, scrutiny, accountability, sanctions for ministers and departments
